Dear Parent or Guardian:

Re-admission of pupils who have been absent from school because of communicable disease is governed by the following: When your child is sent home from school for illness, please keep him/her home the next day. Students must be fever free for 24 hours without medication. Students with temperatures 101° or above, vomiting, and/or with diarrhea the night before or in the morning, should not be in school that day.

The control of contagious and infectious diseases is an important part of school Health Services. Consistent with the Code of Virginia and NNPS School Board Policy JLCC, students having or suspected of having contagious or infectious diseases may be excluded from school. Exclusion and readmission of students will be based upon: absence of the contagious or infectious disease (written approval from a doctor may be required); recommendations of the school division's medical advisor; recommendation of the medical review committee established in Procedure JLCC-P; and/or the school nurses assessment of the student.
